1,600 Deloitte New England employees volunteer at nonprofits today

As part of its annual corporate volunteer day, Deloitte on Friday announced that its commitment to pro-bono services to nonprofits – consulting, financial advisory services and tax services – will reach \$110 million by 2015, according to a release issued by the company.

Over the past three years, Deloitte has completed more than 300 such pro-bono projects, the release said.

Deloitte hosted its 13th corporate volunteer day, known as IMPACT Day, throughout all of its offices nationwide, including Boston.

Thousands of employees worked on a variety of volunteer projects – including painting, landscaping and renovating – in communities throughout the city.

Also in Boston, Deloitte's IMPACT day began with a joint nonprofit/education symposium covering topics such as growth, scale and analytics and featuring speakers from Deloitte and a range of nonprofits, including City Year, The Boston Foundation and the Dudley Street Neighborhood Initiative.

In May, Deloitte announced that it would renew a three-year, \$4 million donation to City Year, both in cash and in-kind services.
